SIPA FAREWELLS OUTGOING CHAIRMAN



Solomon Ports on 19 September week formally farewelled its outgoing Board Chairman, Mr. Mike Wate, during a ceremony held at the Honiara Port Headquarters.

The small but significant event was organized on Thursday 18 by the Board of Directors, Executive, and Management of Solomon Ports to acknowledge and recognize Mr. Wate's outstanding contributions and leadership over the years.

Mr. Wate first joined Solomon Ports in 2017 as Interim CEO, before serving as a Board Director and Deputy Chairman from December 2018 to 2021. He was later appointed Chairman in May 2023, a role he held until this year.

He is succeeded by Mr. Moses Virivolomo, who is no stranger to Solomon Ports, having served as a Board Director for the past 5 years, and was recently appointed as Chairman effective on 4th August 2025.

Solomon Ports takes part in 47th PMTA

Solomon Ports has successfully completed its participation in the 47th Pacific Maritime Transport Alliance (PMTA) Conference, held in Rarotonga, Cook Islands, from 18-20 August under the theme "Building Stronger Pacific Ports, Regional Collaboration, Sustainable Infrastructure, and a Skilled and Resilient Workforce."

The Solomon Ports delegation was led by Chief Executive Officer Mr. George Rausi, accompanied by Captain Percy Biliki (Harbour Master), Mr. James Kabini (Assistant Manager – Operations), Ms. Suellen Teferomu (Legal Officer), and Mr. Lowen Sei (Senior Communications and Media Officer).

The PMTA Conference is an annual regional Ports meeting to discuss shared challenges, and find pathways to improve the maritime transport and Port sector, with the sharing of ideas, and solutions to address common challenges faced by Pacific Ports, from climate change to digitalization, improving aging infrastructure and more.

CEO Rausi was a key panelist in the opening session, "The State of Pacific Ports," where he presented Solomon Ports' experience and insights on pressing industry issues. His contribution emphasized the Authority's ongoing efforts to address challenges such as aging infrastructure, digitalization, and efficiency improvements. He also highlighted the importance of setting regional benchmarks for Pacific ports and called for stronger collaboration and knowledge sharing across the region.

On Day Two of the conference, CEO Rausi delivered the Solomon Islands country report, which outlined the Authority's major achievements since the last PMTA Conference in Nadi, Fiji. He also updated on Solomon Ports' long-term strategic priorities, showcasing future strategies aimed at strengthening port infrastructure, sustainability, and operational excellence.

Speaking after the conference, CEO Rausi reaffirmed Solomon Ports' commitment to contributing to the

collective growth of Pacific ports, stating:

"This conference was an important platform for us to not only share our progress, but also to learn from the experiences of our regional partners. Collaboration is the key to building stronger, more resilient Pacific ports that can withstand global challenges and drive economic growth for our island nations."

The conference brought together port leaders, maritime experts, and stakeholders from across the Pacific, providing a platform to discuss shared challenges and opportunities, while advancing the collective vision of a sustainable and connected Pacific maritime network.

SOLOMON PORTS HOLDS HR POLICY REVIEW WORKSHOP



The Solomon Islands Ports Authority (SIPA) took an important step toward strengthening its workforce management framework by hosting an HR Policy Review Workshop on June 20, 2025, as part of the ongoing process to finalize its Human Resources (HR) Handbook.

The draft handbook outlines key internal policies, procedures, and standards covering areas such as recruitment, staff performance, conduct, development, and employee entitlements. The review workshop served as a vital platform to validate the document and ensure it accurately reflects SIPA's operational realities and staff needs.

Key objectives of the session included:

Presenting the draft HR Handbook in a clear and accessible manner to

all participants.

Facilitating structured discussions to gather feedback, suggestions, and clarifications from staff.

Validating key HR policy areas through collective review and practical staff input.

According to the Human Resource Manager, Mr. Roland Delemani, the workshop represented a crucial stage in the overall policy development process.

"This is a very important part of the consultation and validation process to ensure that the HR policy and procedures document receives the detailed scrutiny it needs before going before the Board for final approval," the HR Manager said.

She added that discussions at the management level were highly



With the guidance of an external HR consultant, the workshop was well-structured to maximize engagement and ensure that every policy area was clearly defined and validated.

Once finalized and approved by the Board, the HR Handbook will provide clear and consistent guidance for SIPA's operations, ensuring the organization continues to function within the framework of national labour laws, regulations, and international best practices.

The event demonstrated Solomon Ports' ongoing commitment to building a fair, transparent, and wellgoverned workplace that supports both staff and organizational excellence.
